- Irrigation systems must be in working order upon visit. The rebate program may not be used to rehabilitate a non-functioning system, for system expansions, or new construction.

About this program

The Tampa Bay Water Wise program was developed in partnership between Tampa Bay Water, the regional wholesale drinking water provider, and the six member governments that purchase the water and deliver it to their residents and businesses: Hillsborough, Pasco and Pinellas counties and the cities of New Port Richey, St. Petersburg and Tampa.
